







Pupils are exceptionally well behaved and show enormous integrity, understanding and respect for rules both in school and in the wider society. They are unfailingly polite.

Skills required for entry into selective secondary schools (both state and independent) are identified and reviewed annually, and are scaled accordingly, to guarantee appropriate progression, revision and consolidation across the whole school; therefore, our curriculum is progressive, so that the teaching and learning that takes place within our classrooms is reflective of the most up-to-date requirements of the entrance examinations.
